

You will experience the benefits of a first-class university located in a picturesque environment within easy access of America's major East Coast cities.

The campus rests in the charming New England town of Durham located on the east coast of the U.S., with great access to cities, mountains and beaches. At UNH, you will be part of a quintessential American university community from day one.



THE BEST OF BOTH WORLDS

The peaceful New England setting of Durham offers the best of both worlds; perfect for both urbanites and outdoor enthusiasts. This university town is located one hour north of Boston and within easy access of the snow topped White Mountains range, the serene Lakes Region or the beaches of the Atlantic Ocean. Being surrounded by stunning mountainous scenery, it's no wonder New Hampshire is referred to as the 'Switzerland of America'.

FOUR DISTINCT SEASONS

The New Hampshire climate offers a range of weather conditions perfectly matched with the four calendar seasons. Summer starts in May and ends in September with relatively hot temperatures, reaching as high as 90°F (32°C). Autumn's vibrant leafy colors of red, yellow and orange come through in September with cooler temperatures of 46° to 62°F (8° to 17°C). The chill of winter begins in November, bringing fluffy, white snow and temperatures ranging from 22° to 36°F (-6° to 2°C). Finally, spring arrives towards the end of March bringing welcoming warmer temperatures of 41° to 60°F (5 to 15°C), as well as blooming flowers.

SAFEST STATE IN THE U.S.

New Hampshire is consistently ranked among the top safest states in the USA. UNH reflects this standing by benefiting from a strong sense of tradition with a responsible, honest and engaged community. Take comfort in knowing that security is available to you on campus 24 hours a day.

GETTING AROUND

The train station on the University of New Hampshire campus goes south to Boston, Massachusetts and north to Portland, Maine. Boston's Logan International Airport is the major international airport for the New England region which offers both domestic flights and direct flights from Boston to a number of international destinations.

CULTURE AND SPORTS

Cultural events can be found both on and off the campus of the University of New Hampshire. The university hosts a number of concerts and exhibitions every year and in the surrounding areas, art galleries, museums, and theaters abound. 

UNH provides opportunities for students to actively engage with employers or undertake research to have a competitive advantage in their chosen field upon graduation.

COLLEGE OF BUSINESS AND ECONOMICS

The Peter T. Paul College of Business and Economics holds the distinct honor of being accredited by AACSB International, the premier accrediting agency for business schools worldwide. Extensive partnerships between the school and the region's business community have, in large part, led to UNH being named one of the nation's top entrepreneurial campuses by *Forbes* and *The Princeton Review*.

UNH was ranked second best in the world in accounting information systems, and number 12 in the world in experimental accounting research. The university's ranking in accounting information systems put it ahead of nearly 200 institutions worldwide.

UNH's Hospitality Management program is among the top two in the USA. Students can focus on hotel and resort management, food and beverages or event management. In order to graduate, students must complete 800 hours of paid internship. Placements to industry leaders, such as Hilton and Marriott, are very high for UNH graduates.

COLLEGE OF LIBERAL ARTS

UNH's College of Liberal Arts offers a broad range of majors and minors that cover social sciences, fine and performing arts, humanities, education, and more. The faculty includes Fulbright scholars, Pulitzer Prize winners and some of the most influential scholars in their fields. The college generates approximately \$6 to \$10 million in sponsored research annually. In keeping with the land-grant mission of the university, the college also includes many key community outreach activities in the fine and performing arts, public policy, education, and the humanities.

The programs of the College of Engineering and Physical Sciences were ranked among the best undergraduate engineering programs in the country by the 2014 *U.S. News & World Report*. 

INTERNATIONAL RESEARCH OPPORTUNITIES PROGRAM (IROP)

IROP grants are competitive awards supporting qualified projects in diverse settings such as government agencies, museums, archaeological and historical sites, laboratories, and field sites. By working closely with a UNH mentor, students identify potential research sites and foreign mentors, and address issues of cross-cultural preparation. Students of all majors may apply for an IROP award to fund their research, scholarly, or creative project.

UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH CONFERENCE (URC)

The Undergraduate Research Conference (URC) is a celebration of academic excellence at the University of New Hampshire. Each year over 1,300 UNH undergraduate students from all academic disciplines present at the URC. The presentations showcase the results of their engaged and creative scholarly research in over 20 professional and artistic venues, making the UNH URC one of the largest conferences of its kind in the country.






Your entry options to UNH

University of New Hampshire offers various programs to cater to students with different levels of academic and English proficiency.

DIRECT ADMISSION

Applicants who meet UNH's undergraduate or graduate admission requirements may apply directly to UNH.

INTERNATIONAL UNIVERSITY TRANSFER PROGRAM / PRE-MASTER'S PROGRAM

UNH offers an International University Transfer Program (IUTP) and Pre-Master's Program (PMP), both designed to prepare you for university studies in the United States. From the day you enroll in either program, you are an UNH student. Successful completion of the IUTP/PMP ensures progression into a UNH degree program and credits earned toward that degree.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE INSTRUCTION

To enter UNH, you need to demonstrate English proficiency. Depending on your English language score, you may be required to take an academic English course to improve your academic reading and writing skills.

All new students in pathway programs at UNH participate in a comprehensive orientation program.

International University Transfer Program (IUTP)

The International University Transfer program (IUTP) at UNH is designed to ensure you gain the skills necessary to excel during your UNH degree.

INTERNATIONAL UNIVERSITY TRANSFER PROGRAM (IUTP): ACADEMIC

The IUTP Academic program is equivalent to the first year of a bachelor's degree. IUTP Academic consists of university credit bearing courses and provides an academic and cultural bridge from your high school experience to studying for a university degree in the United States. Upon successful completion of the IUTP Academic program, you will move directly into the second year of your chosen degree.

To meet the needs of academically advanced students, a two semester IUTP Academic option has been developed to help students quickly progress through year one, while offering the same support and benefits as the IUTP Academic three semester pathway program.

INTERNATIONAL UNIVERSITY TRANSFER PROGRAM (IUTP): ENGLISH

The IUTP English program gives you the opportunity to earn college credits while improving your English proficiency. Upon successful completion of IUTP English, you will progress to the IUTP Academic program, and then move directly into the second year of your chosen degree.

UNH maintains the **highest standards of teaching**, and its programs are delivered by **qualified university instructors** selected for their skill in working with international students.

IUTP English

Students in IUTP English take courses in elementary, intermediate and advanced English as a Second Language (ESL) subjects.

ENGLISH

Classes are divided into Reading/Writing and Speaking/Listening, each taught by a different instructor. Students will receive five hours of instruction, four days per week. Depending on your English proficiency, this program can take between 1–3 semesters to complete.

ESL instructors are available to assist students with course assignments and to offer encouragement and advice about strategies for success.

The average ESL class size is only 12–15 students, which means you will receive individual attention. Upon successful completion of IUTP English, you will progress to IUTP Academic in Business and Economics, Engineering and Physical Sciences or Liberal Arts, and then enter the appropriate bachelor's degree program at UNH.

Skills learned

As you advance in your ESL coursework, you will learn many valuable skills, including:

- how to read and summarize university level texts
- how to write various types of academic essays
- how to prepare and give class presentations
- how to conduct academic research to find information to use in writing assignments

Academic credit

Successful completion of your IUTP English program will result in 16 credits that will be applied to your UNH degree.

IUTP: Academic entry requirements

To be eligible for entry into the IUTP: Academic and IUTP: English programs, all students must have successfully completed a minimum of five core academic subjects including English, Mathematics, Science, Social Sciences, Foreign Languages (e.g. Chinese, Korean, Spanish, Turkish, Vietnamese, Hindi, Urdu, Swahili, etc).

Graduate programs foster a close interdependence between research and classroom teaching and enhance the undergraduate experience at the university. The graduate faculty and students work together to creatively generate new knowledge and disseminate that knowledge.



ME CHEMICAL ENGINEERING

With UNH's Chemical Engineering program, you will have the ability to apply knowledge of mathematics, science, and engineering to identify, formulate, and solve chemical engineering problems. Chemical Engineering students are offered research opportunities in biomedical engineering, biochemical engineering, electrochemical engineering, separations, advanced materials, polymer engineering, reaction engineering and environmental engineering.

Chemical engineering graduates are employed in biotechnology, pharmaceuticals, microelectronics, and fuel cell industries. They also attain research or academic appointments at institutions such as Virginia Commonwealth University, National Library of Medicine, and CFD Research Corporation.

ME CIVIL ENGINEERING

The civil engineering department offers you a broad and diverse engineering discipline that encompasses the design, construction, assessment and maintenance of the constructed and natural infrastructure of society.

Civil Engineering has the following major sub-disciplines: structural engineering, water resources engineering, geotechnical engineering, environmental engineering, and materials engineering. Civil engineers are in high demand due to the expectations placed on the profession to construct and maintain the world's physical infrastructure.

Faculty in the Civil Engineering Department have won numerous teaching and research awards, chaired professorships, and national fellowships. There is significant research activity totaling approximately \$4 million annually.



ME ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING

At UNH, the cornerstone of the Electrical Engineering program is the involvement of students in the solution of real-world problems. You will gain knowledge of advanced electronic circuit and system design through the use of computer-aided design tools, hardware circuit prototyping, and hands-on laboratory testing.

The Electrical Engineering faculty are dedicated to providing students with an outstanding education and many opportunities to work in innovative and advanced research programs. Our faculty have diverse educational backgrounds and broad research interests.

ME MECHANICAL ENGINEERING

Mechanical engineering provides a foundation of knowledge in the basic physical sciences, mechanics of solids and fluids, dynamic systems, thermal sciences, material sciences, and design. This program is designed for students who want to construct real life solutions for modern day mechanical problems.

The department offers the following six concentrations in fluid and thermal science, mechanics, materials science, design and manufacturing, dynamic systems and control, and ocean engineering.

Several of the faculty are also involved in the Ocean Engineering, Integrated Applied Mathematics and Materials Science Graduate Programs, which allow for many opportunities in interdisciplinary study and research. Typical concentrations are in fluid dynamics, acoustics, materials science, solid mechanics, systems modeling, electromechanical design, controls, ocean engineering, advanced manufacturing, and alternative energy.

MS COMPUTER SCIENCE

The Computer Science curriculum emphasizes the fundamentals. We focus on teaching skills and knowledge that leave our graduates feeling confident in an ever-changing field. Since the major tenets of our curriculum are not just about teaching our students to program, our graduates are able to go out into the professional world prepared for a wide-range of jobs and to pursue advanced degrees.

Our faculty members have wide-ranging interests and research projects, with concentrations in artificial intelligence, computer graphics and scientific visualization, database and knowledge base systems, operating systems and computer networks, parallel computing and compiler design, and theoretical computer science. Most of our graduate students are mentored by a faculty member, which often leads to publication and participation in grant-funded projects.

MEMORIAL UNION BUILDING (MUB)






New Hampshire is consistently ranked among the top three safest states, according to the Institute for Economics and Peace. The university offers campus security 24 hours a day. This is provided through the combined efforts of the Durham Police, UNH Police and UNH Security. The UNH Blue Light phone system allows you to contact the UNH Police from any location on campus and receive help within two minutes in the event of an emergency. If you feel uncomfortable walking alone, UNH also offers a free security escort service any time day or night.



UNH was the first university in the nation to earn the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) ENERGY STAR rating for residence halls – Congreve, Lord, and McLaughlin halls.

Scholarships and bursaries

Navitas at UNH has a limited number of scholarships for outstanding students. Scholarships will be issued on a first-come, first-served basis.

US\$10,000 ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE AMBASSADOR SCHOLARSHIP*

Academic excellence scholarships are for students who have shown superior academic performance in high school (students with a 3.5 GPA+ and 6.0 IELTS/80 TOEFL+). An interview with a Navitas at UNH staff member will be required, along with a personal statement. As part of the terms of this scholarship, students are required to perform ambassadorial duties while studying in the Navitas program.

US\$5,000 ACADEMIC MERIT SCHOLARSHIP

Merit scholarships are for students with a high academic qualification (students with a 3.0 GPA+ and 5.5 IELTS/70 TOEFL+) seeking to be rewarded for their performance. An interview with a Navitas Source Country Office or Navitas at UNH staff member will be required.

10% EARLY ACCEPTANCE SCHOLARSHIP*

For high quality students who accept their place at the University of New Hampshire early, we are offering a limited number of scholarships. Students who meet the GPA requirements and have a 5.5 IELTS/70 TOEFL+, can accept their offer by paying the administrative fee before the deadline. The scholarship deadline for the Fall 2016 semester is May 31.



Each year through the Navitas academic merit scholarship program, 162 scholarships are awarded worldwide to students currently studying in Navitas' university pathway colleges and managed campuses.

BERTRAM HUSCH INTERNATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Bertram Husch International Scholarship Fund was established at the University of New Hampshire in 2000. The scholarship is awarded each academic year to international students at UNH who have shown outstanding performance, commitment to excellence and compassion.


